REV. PROFESSOR SHANNON CRAIGO-SNELL, a West Virginia native, is a Christian systematic theologian. From 2001 to 2011, she taught in the Religious Studies Department at Yale University. Her students included undergraduates from many religious backgrounds as well as students with no religious affiliation. Classroom discussions always involved learning from, with, and alongside, one another. She also taught doctoral students and held a secondary appointment at Yale Divinity School.

She joined the faculty of Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary in 2011, where she is professor of theology. She teaches M.A. students training to engage in various forms of ministry, and Doctor of Ministry students furthering their education. In 2014, she was ordained as a teaching elder in the Presbyterian Church (USA). Her work centers on bringing the resources of Christian traditions to bear on current issues.

Professor Craigo-Snell's is the author of numerous books and articles. Her most recent books are *No Innocent Bystanders: Becoming an Ally in the Struggle for Justice* (Westminster John Knox, 2017), co-authored with Christopher Doucot, and *Disciplined Hope: Prayer, Politics, and Resistance* (Cascade Books, 2019).
