PART TWO: THE QUR'AN ON THE DIVINE PURPOSE

CHAPTER FOUR: "ADAM: ALLAH'S FAVORED CREATION":

The Qur'an attaches special importance to human beings in the context of the larger divine purpose. Of particular importance is Allah's proclamation to the *malaikah* (celestial creatures) about breathing "My Spirit" into bashar or al-insan (human being). Allah has endowed human beings with potentialities far beyond those open to other living beings.

CHAPTER FIVE: "ADAM: ALLAH'S KHALIFAH ON EARTH":

That human beings been created to be Allah's *khalifah* (vicegerent) on earth is one of the pivotal themes of the Qur'an. There are a number of Qur'anic references to Allah's command to the *mala'ikah* to prostrate themselves before Adam who has the ability to conceptualize and transcend the level of instinctive or innate knowledge possessed by other creatures.

CHAPTER SIX: "IBLIS AND ALLAH: THE START OF THE COSMIC DRAMA":

The refusal of Iblis to obey Allah's command to prostrate himself before Adam, sets the stage for the cosmic drama involving the eternal opposition between good and evil. A conversation between Allah and Iblis which is of foundational significance in the theological and ethical framework of Islam is narrated in these Qur'anic texts: Surah 7: *Al-'A'raf*: 12-18; Surah 15: *Al-Hijr*: 32-43; Surah 17: *Al 'Israa'*: 61-64; Surah 38: *Sad*: 75-85; and Surah 38: *Sad*: 75-85.
