**Dr. Marcia Texler Segal** (M.A. Columbia University. Ph.D. Indiana University-Bloomington) is Professor of Sociology and Dean for Research Emerita at Indiana University Southeast where she taught a variety of courses including American Ethnic Diversity, Sociology of Religion, Social Problems and Introduction to LGBTQ Studies. She is co-editor of the book series *Advances in Gender Research*. She has worked in countries in in sub-Saharan Africa, Central Asia and Saudi Arabia. She is a “minyanaire” at Adath Jeshurun.

**Rev. Dr. Derek Penwell** (Ph.D. in Humanities, U of L) senior minister of Douglass Boulevard Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) who has taught at U of L. He is the author of *The Mainliner's Survival Guide to the Post-Denominational World*, and *Outlandish: An Unlikely Messiah, a Messy Ministry, and the Call to Mobilize*. He is an activist, unashamedly offering his support in the pursuit of justice for LGBTQ people, Muslims, people of color, immigrants, and other people who are victims of systemic injustice.

**Dr. Riffat Hassan** (B.A. Honors and Ph. D. University of Durham, England, Doctor of Humane Letters, Meadville Lombard Theological Seminary, Chicago)) Professor Emerita at U of L where she taught for 33 years, was born in Pakistan. Widely recognized as a pioneer of Islamic feminist theology and Jewish-Christian-Muslim interreligious dialogue, she is also an activist who has traveled extensively addressing diverse audiences about the Qur'an's strong affirmation of human rights. She is the founder of *The Salaam Network*.
