The Topic:

Muslims believe that the words of the *Qur'an* were revealed through the agency of Archangel Gabriel to Prophet Muhammad (pbuh). Following the prohibition in the Ten Commandments, "You shall not make yourself a carved image or any likeness of anything in heaven or on earth beneath or in the waters under the earth." (*Exodus* 20:4), Islamic Art focused on representing the divinely-revealed words of the Qur'an, making Calligraphy the highest of all art-forms for Muslims who expressed their love and devotion to God through the immaculate beauty and superb craftsmanship of their artistic work. Dr. Saleem Seyal takes us on an inspired journey through the evolution of Calligraphy demonstrating through examples of various styles and scripts, the profound connection between seekers of God and their Beloved who is *Rabb al 'alameen* (God of all peoples and universes)
