

REV. PROFESSOR CHARLES BROCKWELL, Professor of History Emeritus, taught at the University of Louisville from 1969 to 1994. He served as the Chairperson of the Department of History (1971-1974), the First Director of the Program of Studies in Religion (1973-74) and Director, College of Arts & Sciences Honors Program (1982-86). He was a Member of Faculty Senate in the mid-1970s, and Chair, Arts & Sciences Faculty Grievance Committee in the early 1980s. He was Faculty Advisor for Phi Alpha Theta, History Honor Society from the late 1980s to the early 1990s. He was also Faculty Co-Advisor for Mortar Board in the late 1880s. He was the College of Arts & Sciences nominee for University Distinguished Service Award (1993).

Professor Brockwell was the Director of Methodist Studies (the Wesley Connexion) at the Louisville Theological Presbyterian Seminary (1977-present)

He is a minister in both the United Methodist and Presbyterian Church (USA) denominations. As a minister he has held the following offices:

Pastor Fourth Avenue United Methodist Church (1997-2004) Pastor emeritus since 2004

Parish Associate for Member Care, Highland Presbyterian Church (2013-present)

He has served churches in Mid-Kentucky Presbytery and has been a member of the Commission on Preparation for Ministry of the Presbyter, assisting the staff in hospital, nursing home and in-home visitation. This Ministry relates to persons preparing for ordination and works with ordained people and their churches or other venues of approved ministry. Currently, he is a member of the Mid-Kentucky Presbytery Commission on Ministry which works with ordained people and their churches or other venues of approved ministry.

Professor Brockwell has represented the United Methodist Church / World Methodist Council in national and global Christian ecumenical commissions and dialogues (1977-2003)
