

PROFESSOR MARCIA SEGAL is Professor of Sociology and Dean for Research Emerita at Indiana University Southeast. In her years there she developed and taught a variety of courses including American Ethnic Diversity, Sociology of Religion, Social Problems and Introduction to LGBTQ Studies. Her focus now is on Gender from an intersectional perspective.

Her research, teaching and administrative consulting have given her the opportunity to live and work in countries in sub-Saharan Africa and Central Asia. A Joseph Malone Fellowship from the National Council on U.S.-Arab Relations allowed her to spend time in Saudi Arabia.

A recipient of the Albert Nelson Marquis Lifetime Achievement Award in 2019, Professor Segal has contributed to and edited books on topics related to gender, race, ethnicity and religion in the US and around the world. Active professionally in retirement, she is co-editor of the book series *Advances in Gender Research* whose 28th volume was published by Emerald in 2019.

She is a member of the faculty and of the advisory board of the Louisville Florence Melton Adult Jewish Education program and a “*minyanaire*,” one of the congregants at Adath Jeshurun who help to assure that daily lay-led services occur. In addition to being part of The Salaam Network core group, she volunteers for Girl Scouts of Kentuckiana and Communities in Schools of Clark County, Indiana.
